



Ladner Minor Baseball Volunteer Hours

Parents are vital to the success of LMBA. Each LMBA family from Super T to Bantam Divisions is asked to volunteer a minimum of 4 hours of parent participation service. Families with more than one child playing ball with LMBA require a **total** of 4 hours of parent participation. At the end of the season a Parent Participation fee of \$100 will be invoiced and must be paid if the 4 hours have not been completed. Future LMBA registrations will be restricted until the fee is paid in full.

How do I know when volunteer opportunities are available?

It is the responsibility of each family to find volunteer opportunities to fulfill their Parent Participation time. Parents can find out about volunteer opportunities by:

- Contacting an event coordinator
- Watching for postings at concessions
- Connecting with team manager
- Following LMBA Social Media pages

What Activities Count Towards Volunteer Hours

The following are potential opportunities to complete volunteer hours:

- Team positions
 - 1 Head coach per team
 - 1 Assistant coach per team
 - **TADPOLE DIVISION ONLY** 2nd Assistant coach to run the pitching machine
 - 1 team manager
- Photo day
- Installing fences prior to start of season and take down at the end of the season
- Concession volunteer – ***these opportunities can be limited based on concession worker availability***
- LMBA Dance
- Tournaments (pitch count, score keeper and field prep) ****reminder that these activities do not count towards volunteer hours for regular season and play-off games***
- Opening day
- Closing day/Fun Day

Ensure that your team manager records any hours that you volunteer and your name is clearly recorded with your child's name, division, and team.

TEAM MANAGERS will submit the Team Volunteer Hours Summary to the registrar registrar@ladnerminorbaseball.com at the end of the baseball season.

Families that complete the 4 hours of parent participation volunteer time will not be invoiced the \$100 at the end of the spring or summer baseball season.
