Main Rule Differences from 11U Spring Season

- 1. Leadoffs allowed
- 3. Balks will be called (~May)
- 5. Base paths 70'
- 7. "Fair play" rules change
- 2. Dropped 3rd strike
- 4. Infield flies called
- 6. Pitchers throw from 48'

Coach Responsibility

Coaches in 13U will begin to place a higher focus learning baseball strategy and will start to match players' skill sets with positional play. All coaches are still expected to treat all players, parents and other team staff with respect and work together to provide a safe and encouraging environment for all.

Parent Involvement

Parent coaches and team staff are the norm for this age group. Parents will also be required to assist with field preparation, scorekeeping, and pitch count. Most importantly, all parents have the ability to make or break the season for their player and the entire team. Tryouts: Feb 22 & 23 -must attend both

<u>AA:</u>

This competitive team will play a BC Minor interlock schedule with other Fraser Valley associations from April to June for the spring season.

Spring tryouts: Mar 1&2 -must attend both

Summer season will run from July to August with tryouts occuring during the spring season. Note that players who play AA in spring and do not make the AA summer ball team can only play A ball if there is a spot and BC Minor approves.

<u>A:</u>

The number of teams will be determined by total registration. These teams will play an interlock schedule with other Fraser Valley associations from April to June for the spring season. Players will be drafted to teams after AAA and AA selections have been completed.

Summer season will run from July to August with tryouts occurring during the spring season.
